


# Teku Teku Map (Walking Map)

### Kameishi (Tortoise Stone)

A giant rock 4 meters long, 2 meters wide and 2 meters high. Since the engraved face resembles a tortoise, this name was given. It creates an utterly humorous atmosphere.



### Tachibana-dera Temple

This place is believed to be the birthplace of Prince Shotoku, who is one of the great men representative of Japan, and this temple itself was established by Prince Shotoku. Prince Shotoku had a strong Buddhist faith and supported the emperor in striving to build a nation centered on the emperor at the beginning of the 7th century.



### Takamatsuzuka Mural Museum

In 1972, wall paintings of noble people that were drawn from the end of the 7th century to the beginning of 8th century were excavated. Visitors can view replicas that faithfully reproduce the conditions at the time of excavation. Next to the Museum is the Takamatsuzuka Tumulus, which is preserved in the earth.



### Ishibutai Tumulus

The Ishibutai Tumulus is made of 2,300-ton giant rocks. It is believed to be the tomb of Soga no Umako, a powerful figure who exercised his power in this area at the beginning of the 7th century. Visitors can walk into the tomb. The surrounding area is well-known for its magnificent cherry trees.



### Oka-dera Temple

The Nyoirin Kannon Bosatsu statue, the primary Buddha of worship, is a nationally designated important cultural property. It is Japan's largest clay figure, approximately 5 meters tall. The three-story pagoda in the precincts commands a panoramic view of Asuka. Alpine roses come into blossom beautifully from late April to the beginning of May.

# Asuka 1 Hiking Course

- Approx. 45 minutes from Osaka-Abenobashi Sta. to Asuka Sta.
- Approx. 1 hour 5 minutes by Limited Express from Kyoto Sta. to Asuka Sta. (transferring at Kashiharajingu-mae Sta.)
- Approx. 2 hours 20 minutes by Limited Express from Kintetsu-Nagoya Sta. to Asuka Sta. (transferring at Yamato-Yagi Sta. and Kashiharajingu-mae Sta.)
