### Amakashi-no-Oka Observatory

This observatory commands a panoramic view of Asuka, which looks like a beautiful miniature garden, and the famous Three Mountains of Yamato — Mt. Unebi, Mt. Kagu and Mt. Miminashi — and distant views of Mt. Ikoma, Mt. Nijo and other mountains.



### Asukaniimasu-jinja Shrine

This shrine is on a small hill. It is well-known as the shrine where the famous Onda Festival is held in February to pray for a good harvest for the year, and visitors can view photographs of the festival on the precincts. Unique good-luck charms are sold here.

# Asuka ② Hiking Course

- Approx. 40 minutes from Osaka-Abenobashi Sta. to Kashiharajingu-mae Sta.
- Approx. 50 minutes by Limited Express from Kyoto Sta. to Kashiharajingu-mae Sta.
- Approx. 2 hours 5 minutes by Limited Express from Kintetsu-Nagoya Sta. to Kashiharajingu-mae Sta. (transferring at Yamato-Yagi Sta.)

### Hiking Manners

- \*Bring all trash you create back home.
  - \*To prevent fires, do not throw away cigarette butts.
  - \*To conserve nature, do not collect plants.
- Each figure on the map indicates the actual measured distance (in meters) from the starting point.
  - Admission to some shrines, temples, facilities, etc. along the course require fees.
  - Since Teku Teku Map is illustrated, when actually walking the course, please prepare a detailed map by yourself.
